Part I: Priorities

Modifications in the text are indicated by "underline" (where changed) or "strikeout" (where deleted).

Page 8, Chapter 2, 1st paragraph

Current text:

The Erasmus University Charter sets out the fundamental principles underlying the Erasmus activities any higher education institution has to respect. Any higher education institution wishing to participate in Erasmus must hold a Charter. In contrast, intermediary bodies organising student placements may apply without requesting an Erasmus University Charter.

Revised text:

The Erasmus University Charter sets out the fundamental principles underlying the Erasmus activities any higher education institution has to respect. Any higher education institution which wants to participate in Erasmus must hold a Charter, except if it wants to participate simply as a partner in Multilateral Projects, Networks or Accompanying Measures projects. Intermediary organisations involved in student placements that are not a higher education institution do not need to hold a Charter to participate in Erasmus.
